### Legacy Leaders: Building Our Future with Wisdom

As a young person I remember loving Jesus, but I was a hot mess with no real direction. Not having it all together, I did not know how to lead myself in a world that was unforgiving. The goal with Legacy Leaders is to sow leadership qualities into each student to at least offer them ingredients to lead themselves well.

Legacy Leaders in the month of November has

carried a theme of "wisdom". November did not afford us the opportunity to cover wisdom every Monday. Here is our key verse we used to cover wisdom with.

Proverbs 4:7-9 "Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore get wisdom: And with all thy getting, get understanding. Exalt her, and she shall promote thee: She shall bring thee to honour, when thou dost embrace her. She shall give to thine head an ornament of grace: A crown of glory shall she deliver to thee."

Here are some of the points we covered speaking about wisdom.

1. Building your life with wisdom- "Wisdom is the principal thing" means that wisdom comes first in time. Luke 2:52 states that Jesus increased in wisdom, stature, and in favor with God and man. If children are to be trained up in the way they should go according to Proverbs 22:6, they need to be teachable and wisdom must be made of most value in their eyes.

2. Exalt Wisdom and she will promote you- If we

keep wisdom lifted up in our life, making wisdom a priority will cause us to advance through the course of our journey before God. What is the catch? In a world of microwaves and instant access to most anything wisdom will require patience of us to walk with her. With others around us making knee jerk responses to just get something over with wisdom will buffer us causing us to wait.

3. Through wisdom a house is built (Proverbs 24:3)- Are we willing to become skillful with wisdom. Obviously we have specific tools used to build a house in different stages. It takes a skillful craftsman to work with a given tool. However, take note we can become handy with wisdom and build a house with it. With wisdom we can build our lives.
